Organizing the Process

Student Responsibility

- o College requirements: Auditions, portfolios, interviews, testing, etc.
- Deadlines: Application and Financial Aid
- o System: Find one that works for you

Range of Schools

- o Recommendation: 8-12 schools (Safeties, Targets, and Reaches)
 - Use Naviance Scattergram

Researching Schools

Resources: Naviance, College Board or Princeton Review

College Visits/Interviews


- Check Naviance for MHS College Visits
- Register online for college tours and information sessions
- Demonstrated interest: important
- Interviews: Check availability

MHS College Visits

- MHS College Visits: Over 90 admissions reps from colleges and universities
 - To Sign Up: Log into Naviance at student.naviance.com/marblehead
 - If student wants a reminder: Add the college to "Colleges I'm Thinking About" list on Naviance
- College Visit Pass:
 - At least <u>24 hours before</u> the event
 - · Obtain gold pass from School Counseling Office (Ms. Benman)
 - · Have it signed by the teacher of the missed class
 - · Can miss the same class up to two times
 - Cannot miss any assessments
- Day of College Visit:
 - Report to class first and get a SmartPass to School Counseling for the visit
 - Return to class on a SmartPass after the visit
- FLEX/MAGIC Blocks: Register on My Flex Learning at least 24 hours in advance

Signing Up for College Rep Visits to MHS

Log in to **Naviance** → Click the Colleges tab up top → Click College Visits → Click Register Now



Transcript Request Process

The MHS Transcript Request Form:

Located on the School Counseling section of the MHS website: MHS School Counseling

Download Form: Editable PDF; save it to your desktop or files

Complete the Form:

Please add every college you are applying to

- Full College Name: Use official names, not initials, indicate campus
- Application Method: Indicate if applying via Common App or Non-Common App
- Application Deadline: Note the actual college deadline (not ASAP or when you plan to send your application)
- **Application Type**: Specify (e.g., ED, EA, RD, Rolling)
- Do not put the same college twice

Transcript Request Process

Once your form is completed:

- Submit Transcript Request Form: Email to mhs_transcripts@marbleheadschools.org
- **Email Subject**: Your First and Last Name
- One Time Processing Fee: \$10, paid via My School Bucks
- Multiple Transcript Request Forms: You can submit more than one form
- Do not send transcript request forms to your school counselor
- Naviance Update: Colleges will appear in "Colleges I'm Applying to" once processed
- **The transcript form** includes submission of transcript, school profile, MHS letters of recommendation (teacher and school counselor), and secondary school report

School Counseling Office requires transcript forms to be submitted at least 3 weeks prior to the admissions deadline

Paying for Transcripts- My School Bucks

 Log into My School Bucks → School Store → Select Transcript Fees (One Time Transcript Processing Fee- \$10)

If your college is Rolling Admissions, please allow three (3) weeks for processing

Teacher Recommendation

Once student knows 1st application deadline - **Student emails/contacts teacher**

Follow up with the teacher to find out if they need anything

Do **NOT** invite the teacher to be a recommender through the <u>Common App</u>

Send a thank you note to the teacher writing your recommendation



Recommendations are confidential

Outside Recommendations

- Student's responsibility to coordinate outside recommendations
- School counseling department <u>only</u> sends MHS teacher recommendations
- Only invite outside recommenders via Common App (not MHS teachers)

Be mindful of the number of recommendations - always check the college website for requirements & follow the requirements

Recommendations are confidential

Standardized Testing

- **Deemphasized Tests**: SAT/ACT less critical for many colleges
- **Test Optional**: Many schools don't require test scores
- Check Requirements: Refer to college websites for testing policies
- **Resource**: Visit <u>www.fairtest.org</u> for test options
- Supplemental Information: Check if colleges need additional materials (e.g., graded essay)
- Test Blind: 70+ colleges do not consider test scores, even if submitted
- **Test Flexible:** Colleges/Universities allow students to choose which type of test they want to submit with their application (i.e. SAT, ACT, or AP Scores)

- Register at <u>www.sat.org/register</u>
 - o Marblehead School Code: 221-325

• Upcoming dates

- October 5th (Late registration deadline September 24th)
- November 2nd (Registration deadline October 18th)
- December 7th (Registration deadline November 22nd)

Info

- Most Colleges "superscore" take the top score for each section
 - Required to submit by testing administration
- o 4 free submissions of test scores Must be sent blind
- Pay once: Send any number of scores
- Check Deadlines: Confirm last test date allowed by each college
- Self-Reporting: Some colleges allow this—verify with each college

ACT Testing

Register at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>

Marblehead School Code: 221-325

Upcoming dates

- October 26th (Late Registration deadline October 7th)
- December 14th (Registration deadline November 8th)

Info

- ACT vs. SAT: All colleges accept either test
- Superscore: Some colleges combine top ACT section scores—check with each college
- 4 Free Submissions: Must be sent without seeing the scores
- Separate Payment: Pay for each test administration

Sending Scores

- Send Scores Directly to Colleges: Use College Board or ACT
- Check SAT/ACT Concordance Chart: Determine which scores to send
- Consult With Your School Counselor: For questions on which scores to send
- Send Scores Early: 2 to 3 weeks before college deadlines
- Self-Report Scores on Common App: Only if testing is complete;
 report upcoming test dates if necessary
- Test-Optional Schools: Do not self-report scores on Common App if holding scores

How to apply to college?

- 1. Common Application
- 2. Coalition Application
- College/University Application

- **Direct Admissions Process**: Participating colleges set specific requirements (e.g., minimum GPA) and offer opportunities like essay waivers for qualified first-generation, lowand middle-income students identified by Common App.
- Application Benefits & Review: Students receive non-binding admissions offers via Common App, with no application fee required. Colleges verify application accuracy and ensure alignment with stated criteria, including program-specific exceptions.
- Criteria and eligibility vary by college

Application Types

• Early Decision Limited to applying to one school ED and EDII

Binding Agreement - Required to attend if accepted

• Early Action Can apply to as many schools through EA

Non-Binding agreement

Early application review and early notification

Restrictive Early Action
Non-binding

College specific, very few schools have this option

Students may only apply to one college REA

Can't apply ED elsewhere, check college requirements

Can usually apply EA to public schools

Application Types

• **Regular Decision** Apply by standard application deadline

Allows more time to prepare application

Usually notified by mid-April

• Rolling Admissions Applications reviewed as they come in

Decision issued as soon as application is processed

Submit sooner rather than later

Admission Decisions

- Accepted
- Denied
- Deferred
 - Moved to the regular decision pool
 - Can send updated grades
 - Colleges may request additional information
- Waitlisted
 - Students must sign up/accept their waitlist spot
 - Waitlist criteria varies by college
 - Must deposit at another college

College Application Process

- Student/Parent/Guardian Responsibility
 - Complete FERPA/WAIVER: For Common Application
 - Link Accounts: Common Application and Naviance
 - o Online Transcript Request Form: Due 3 weeks before the application deadline
 - Application Processing Fee: \$10 via My School Bucks
 - Complete Application: Pay fee when submitting electronically or by mail
 - Submit Additional Documents: Essays, resume, portfolio, etc.
 - Submit Accommodations Info: 504/IEP/testing information, if needed
 - Invite/Organize Outside Recommendations
 - Send Test Scores: Via <u>College Board</u> or <u>ACT</u>
 - Score Processing Time: 2-4 weeks for schools to receive
 - Use Concordance Charts: To align SAT and ACT scores
 - Contact Financial Aid Offices: For FAFSA/CSS Profile deadlines
 - Athletes: Check NCAA requirements and register online through NCAA Clearinghouse

School Counselor Responsibilities

School Counselors will submit:

- Initial Transcript
- Quarter 1 Grades (automatically submitted for ED & EA applicants)
- Mid-year Report
- Final Transcript
- Counselor Recommendations / Secondary School Report
- Marblehead High School teacher recommendations and evaluations

College Application Timeline - Fall

- Update Student Information Sheet in School Counseling Class of 2025 Google Classroom
- Contact recommending teachers and remind them of application deadlines
- Students should set up 1:1 meeting with their school counselor
- Finalize college essay and college list on Naviance
- Submit transcript request form to initiate application process
- Know requirements for each college/university (application deadlines, FAFSA and CSS Profile due dates, testing requirements, supplemental requirements)
- Submit official test scores to colleges through ACT or College Board, if required
- Apply for financial aid
 - FAFSA will be available on December 1st and CSS Profile will be available on October 1st
- Quarter 1 grades will automatically be submitted
 - Students must complete a required Google form if they do not want their grades sent

College Application Timeline

Winter Tasks

- Submit applications (aim to finish before winter break for early deadlines)
- Mid-year grades will be automatically submitted
 - Students must complete a required Google form if they do not want their grades sent
- Confirm application materials have been received through each school's portal
- Apply for any applicable scholarships please refer to scholarship resources

Spring Tasks

- MHS scholarship website will be available in the Spring
 - Scholarship Assembly will be held for all seniors in early March
- Submit a deposit and commit to a school by May 1st
- Write thank you notes (recommending teachers and scholarships received)

Day Zero - October 23rd

Students will sign up for one:

- 1. College essay support
- 2. Visiting a college or vocational school
- 3. Resume writing support

Seniors will sign up through a Google Form

 - Based on 2023 tax returns (FAFSA 2025-2026)
- **CSS Profile**: Submit through https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org/
 - Available October 1st
 - Typically required by private schools
- Check individual school deadlines and required forms
- Financial Aid Night: Thursday, October 24th at 6:00pm
