MHS College Visits


- 100+ college visits from college admissions representatives
- To sign up for visits, log into Naviance account: <u>student.naviance.com/marblehead</u>
- In order to receive reminders, the specific college <u>must be added</u> to <u>"Colleges I'm</u>
 <u>Thinking About"</u> list on Naviance
- At least **24 hours** before the event, students must have a college visit pass signed by the teacher of the class that is missed to attend the college visit. Passes can be picked up in the School Counseling Office, from the school counseling assistant, Ms. Benman.
- Students must report to class first and receive a SmartPass (to *Sch Counseling on SmartPass*) for the college visit. Students will be sent back to class on a SmartPass once the visit has ended.
- If a college will be visiting during a FLEX/MAGIC block, students are required to register on My Flex Learning at least 24 hours ahead of time

Organizing the Process

- Responsibility of the student
 - Requirements for each school
 - Application due dates and financial aid deadlines
 - Stay organized Find a system that works best for you
- Range of Schools
 - Recommend 8-12 colleges
 - Safeties, Reaches, Targets
 - Naviance Scattergrams
- Researching Schools
 - Naviance
 - College Board
 - o Princeton Review
- College Visits/Interviews Refer to Naviance for MHS college visit dates
 - Register for college tours and information sessions online
 - Demonstrated interest is important
 - Check to see if an interview is available (evaluative vs informative)

Transcript Request Form

The MHS Transcript Request Form is available on the mainpage of the School Counseling section of the MHS website:

- Download the editable PDF transcript request form and save it to your desktop or your files if using a Chromebook
- When completing the form:
 - Add the full official college name (do not use initials) and indicate campus
 - Identify if you will be applying on the Common App or Non-Common App
 - Please note *actual* college application deadline (not ASAP or when you plan on sending your application)
 - Please note application type (i.e. ED, EA, RD, Rolling)


Transcript Request Process

- Once transcript request form is completed:
 - Submit via email to: mhs transcripts@marbleheadschools.org
 - The subject to the email should be student's *First and Last Name*
 - One time \$10 transcript processing fee through My School Bucks
- Students can submit more than one transcript request form
- Do *not* email the transcript request form to your school counselor. The form will not be processed.
- Once a transcript request form is processed, colleges will appear in "*Colleges I'm Applying to*" on Naviance

***School Counseling Office requires transcript forms to be submitted at least 3 weeks prior to the admissions deadline ***

Paying for Transcripts- My School Bucks

Recommendations

- Teacher Recommendations
 - Email your teacher as soon as you know your first application deadline and find out if they require any additional information
 - MHS recommendations are confidential
 - Do NOT invite your teacher to be a recommender through the Common App
 - Send a thank you note to your teacher writing your recommendation
- Outside Recommendations
 - Student's responsibility to coordinate outside recommendations
 - School counseling department only sends MHS teacher recommendations
 - Only invite outside recommenders through the Common App (not your teachers)

Be mindful of the number of recommendations - always check the college website for requirements and follow the requirements

College Application Process

- Student/Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:
 - Complete the Common Application FERPA/WAIVER
 - Link Common Application and Naviance accounts
 - Complete Online Transcript Request Forms Due three weeks before application due date / Submit one time \$10 application processing fee through My School Bucks
 - Complete application fee required when submitting applications electronically or mail
 - Submit essay and other required documentation (resume, portfolio, etc., if applicable)
 - Submit 504/IEP/testing information if you are applying for specific accommodations
 - Submit outside recommendations
 - Send ACT, SAT scores via <u>www.collegeboard.org</u> or <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
 - Can take 2-4 weeks for schools to receive scores
 - Concordance Charts are distributed to students to determine how scores align (SAT and ACT) - <u>ACT & SAT Score Conversion Chart</u>
 - Contact Financial Aid Offices of prospective colleges to determine FAFSA/CSS Profile deadlines
 - Athletes: Please check NCAA requirements and register online through NCAA clearinghouse, if applicable

Counselor Responsibilities

- School Counselors will submit:
 - Initial Transcript
 - Quarter 1 Grades (automatically submitted for ED & EA applicants)
 - Mid-year Report
 - Final Transcript
 - Counselor Recommendations / Secondary School Report
 - Marblehead High School teacher recommendations and evaluations
 - School Profile including a statement about COVID

Admissions Criteria

Early Decision

- Apply ED I (usually in November) or ED II (usually January) to first choice college
- Apply to only one school ED Binding agreement
- Student can apply to other colleges under regular or early action however must withdraw all other applications if accepted by ED
- Will receive an admission decision usually by December/Early January or March/April

Early Action

- Students apply early (usually mid November)
- Students will receive an admission decision early in cycle (usually in January or February)
- Students can apply to other colleges under early action or regular admission
- Student must commit by May 1st

• Restrictive Early Action

- Non-binding
- Check each college admissions restrictions per school

Admissions Criteria Continued

- Regular Decision
 - Student applies by published deadline
 - Decision letters typically delivered by late March/Early April
- Rolling
 - Encouraged to submit applications sooner rather than later



Application Decisions

- Accepted
- Denied
- Deferred
 - Moved to the regular decision pool
 - Can send updated grades
 - Colleges may request additional information
- Waitlisted
 - Students must sign up/accept their waitlist spot
 - Waitlist criteria varies by college
 - Must deposit at another college






Standardized Testing

- The standardized tests SAT/ACT have been deemphasized
- Many colleges continue to be test optional
- Refer to the college/university website for testing requirements
- A good resource regarding test options <u>www.fairtest.org</u>
- Check to see if colleges require supplemental information (ex: graded essay)
- Currently, 80+ colleges are test blind they will not consider the test scores even if you submit the scores

SAT Testing



- MHS School Code to receive student scores 221-325
- SAT Register at <u>www.sat.org/register</u>
 - Future SAT Dates -
 - October 7, 2023 (*Late Registration deadline September 26, 2023)
 - November 4, 2023 (Registration deadline October 5, 2023)
 - December 2, 2023 (Registration deadline November 2, 2023)




SAT Testing

- Most Colleges "superscore" take the top score for each section
 - Required to submit by testing administration
- Four free submissions of test scores Must be sent blind
- Pay once and send whatever scores you want.
- Check individual college websites to determine the last test date they will allow for the application deadline
- Some colleges allow self reporting of your scores check individual college

ACT Testing

- ACT is a competitor to SAT All colleges will accept either test
- MHS School Code to receive student scores 221-325
- ACT Register at <u>www.actstudent.org</u>
 - Future ACT Dates -
 - October 28, 2023 (Late Registration deadline Oct. 6, 2023)
 - December 9, 2023 (Registration deadline Nov. 17, 2023)
- Some schools "superscore" ACT ~ check with each college
- Four free submissions must be sent blind
- Pay separately to send each test administration





Sending Scores to Colleges

- Student/Parents/Guardians are responsible for sending scores directly to colleges through *College Board or ACT*
- Refer to SAT/ACT Concordance Chart to determine what scores to send
- See your counselor with any questions about which scores to send
- Send scores (SAT/ACT) 2 to 3 weeks prior to college deadline
- Only self report scores on the Common Application if you have finished testing - students can report upcoming test dates
- If you are applying to a school that is test optional and you want to hold scores *DO NOT SELF REPORT ON THE COMMON APP*

College Application Timeline

• Fall

- Set up a college meeting with your school counselor
- Update "Brag Sheet"- Student Information Sheet the School Counseling Class of 2024 Google Classroom
- Contact teachers that agreed to write recommendations back in Spring
 - Update teachers of application deadlines
- Attend College Visits
- Finalize College Lists on Naviance
- Early Decision and Early Action Applications
 - Identify specific deadlines
- Submitting SAT, ACT Scores to your colleges if required
- Set up interviews/auditions if colleges recommend or request them apart of the application; be mindful of art portfolio requirements
- FAFSA Will be available in December, 2023



College Application Timeline

- Winter
 - Try to complete all applications prior to Winter Break
 - Mid Year grades will be sent to all colleges
 - Students must notify the school counseling office if they do NOT want their mid year grades sent!
 - Confirm that colleges have received all the necessary application materials
- Spring
 - Scholarship information will be made available in March
 - Students must submit enrollment form and deposit by May 1st deadline

- Check individual institution Financial Aid deadlines
- Know what forms are required for each school
