MHS Class of 2023 Acceptances - 132 colleges




























Transportation Update

The transportation department has 3 full time bus drivers, and 1 part time bus driver. We also have 2 additional staff members that are licensed and provide back-up as bus drivers.

Currently we provide transportation for 157 students, 24 of the 157 students participate in the pay to ride program. We have 20 open seats available, we run 3 bus routes and a 7D vehicle daily.

Re: Sustainability efforts at Brown

The sustainability efforts at Brown were of great consideration when the building was constructed.

- -The Organic Gardens provide ongoing environmental science and sustainability lessons including organic gardening's impact on soil, insects, birds, and organisms. Additionally, the gardens provide food to the greater community.
- -The five water stations, located outside the gym, the first floor, second floor, and gym, all track the total number of water bottles saved by their daily use. As of today, 16,993 water bottles have been saved through the use of our four water filling stations.
- -Recycling efforts include bins in each classroom for paper and cardboard.
- -Reusable cafeteria trays and silverware are used in our cafeteria to reduce overall waste.

Re: Sustainability efforts at Glover School


Glover School is working hard to reduce waste and increase recycling efforts. Each classroom at Glover has a recycling bin and students are encouraged to recycle paper products instead of throwing them away. This spring, we will be restarting, "Trash Talkers". Third grade students will reinforce the message to recycle during our community meetings and have a weekly job of collecting the recycling weekly throughout the school. In addition, there are four water bottle filling stations at Glover, one outside the first and second floor bathrooms, one outside the gym, and one located in the cafeteria. Students are encouraged to bring refillable water bottles instead of single use plastic bottles.

Glover School has organic gardens which were installed during the 2021-2022 school year. Sustainability was considered when installing the garden, which included certified drinking water safe garden hoses, lead free attachments, primarily metal tools, and minimal new plastic. This year, Glover also started a Harvest of the Month Program. Both of these were supported by a grant from The Friends of Marblehead Public Schools written by Glover parent Kaya Frechette. Last year, classes helped to care for the garden and this fall kindergarten students learned about physical science and the cycle of a pumpkin seed. We are looking forward to accessing our gardens again this spring. Through Harvest of the Month, students are able to sample different fruits and vegetables from local farms. To date, students have been able to sample tomatoes, pears, kale, carrots, apples, and squash. Information about each sampling is shared with students and families through an electronic flier. Glover parent Kristen Durand has been spearheading this program for the 2022-2023 school year and parent volunteers help oversee the samplings in the Glover cafeteria.

This past fall, Glover worked with Safe Routes to School which helped conduct an arrival and dismissal audit. Parents, Matt Harrington and Mark Holland, have helped to oversee this process. This spring, we will be working with Safe Routes to hold a bike safety training class for families and are also working on incorporating a bike route for families so that more children and families can bike to school together.

Re: Sustainability efforts at MVMS

Over the past few years, the sustainability efforts at MVMS have been focused on the reduction of general trash and the elimination of single-use water bottles. Through one of our clubs — The Green Team — our students have educated their peers about waste reduction in the cafeteria and the school. This includes having student volunteers actively watch over the trash process every day in the cafeteria, to ensure that refuse is disposed of correctly into one of the four options — Recycling, Trash, Compost, and Trays. This effort has been supported by the Food Service department's shift to compostable trays. Through this program, we have cut our lunch time landfill trash in half. Prior to our sustainability efforts, every lunch used to produce at least two garbage bags of landfill trash, totaling four per school day. With our active recycling and composting efforts, each lunch now only produces one bag of landfill trash. The Green Team, and their advisor Ms. Kate Reynolds, have be instrumental in this process. Beyond the daily monitoring of the lunchroom trash, they have also used posters like the one below to reinforce what type of trash should end up in the various receptacles.

Additionally, through the generosity of Sustainable Marblehead and the MVMS PCO, we have installed four water bottle filling stations throughout our school to eliminate the need for single-use plastic water bottles. We actively encourage and educate students and families on the benefits of bringing a reusable water bottle to school every day. The four stations, located in the cafeteria, the second floor, third floor, and gym, all track the total number of water bottles saved by their daily use. As of today, 23,795 water bottles have been saved through the use of our four water filling stations.

- 1. Composting MHS Cafeteria. Station is set up for collection of biodegradable trays, food waste and recyclables. Composting led by MHS chapter of the National Green Schools Society (NGSS).
- 2. Water bottle filling stations at MHS. Large amount of use by students and staff. Located in Café area, 2nd and 3rd floors.
- 3. Recycling in classrooms and office areas. Recycling containers located in each classroom and office space. Emptied by student volunteers.
- 4. The MHS chapter of the National Green Schools Society (NGSS) is an environmental honor society dedicated to climate action in the school and the local community. Advisors MHS teachers Connor Ryan and Sara Roberge. 70+ students have joined this organization, leading weekly cleanups, sustainability awareness campaigns, and environmental partnerships with other schools and organizations in the district. Two other NGSS sponsored activities:
 - a. Clothing Drive for National Green Schools Society's Clothing Swap
 - b. Sustainable Holiday Gifts from NGSS
- 5. Greenhouse Project though not online at this point, will be part of MHS sustainability efforts.
